The Kurashiki store is situated at the entrance to the Bikan Historical Area-known for its white-walled streets, rickshaws, and boats crossing the Kurashiki River. The building repurposed with traditional renovation techniques is a Meiji-era (1868-1912) townhouse embodying the theme "Museum of Time" blending seamlessly into the picturesque surroundings.
